
Modern Languages Curriculum - KS3

Intent:

Foreign languages enable pupils to develop their critical thinking and problem-solving skills, needed to become articulate, open minded communicators. Our aim is to provide a high-quality language education that deepens pupils' knowledge and understanding of the world; that fosters pupils' curiosity and enables them to express ideas and opinions in a wide range of contexts. From KS3 to KS4, students are provided with opportunities to develop their oral and written communication skills by listening for gist and by exploring a wide range of authentic written work.



Topics:

Y7 curriculum

Term 1: Self identity. Students explore key features of foreign languages – discuss family and siblings and express justified opinions.

Term 2: School life. Students discuss school subjects, rules and daily routines and explore a typical foreign school.

Term 3: Free time. Students discuss sports & hobbies, sports in the UK and abroad, and what they are going to do at the weekend – using present and future timeframes and they create a spoken interview with a foreign celebrity.

Y8 curriculum

Term 1: Media studies. Students explore how various media is used to communicate (TV, social media, cinema, literature) and discuss what they do and did when connected to the internet.

Term 2: A foreign city. Students explore the cultural aspects of a European city and create an account of their experience abroad (past and present).

Term 3: Identity and culture. Students talk about their personality and music tastes using present, past and future timeframes.
