We have completed our second week of this half-term and continue to move forward, positively. Thankfully, we have not had to deal with storms over the past five days which has been a pleasant change! On Wednesday evening of this week, whilst undertaking a site walk, I was struck by how many pupils were on site after the school day. This is always a good marker of young people enjoying the lived experience of their school. We had year 11 pupils involved in some extra revision sessions in maths, focused groups of pupils working in art and photography, young people honing their skills in music, the cast of *Alice in Wonderland* is taking shape and of course the many sports fixtures taking place all over the region. I also can't write my newsletter this week without mentioning our remembrance event this morning. We had all pupils, now over a thousand, together, remembering those individuals who have put themselves forward to protect the freedoms that we continue to enjoy. Updates this week for you are as follows:

- Year 11 mock examinations A reminder that our mock examination timetable for year 11 begins on Wednesday 15th November. This is a challenging time for our year 11 cohort (and their families) and I request the empathy from all our school community whilst they are experiencing this process. This includes making sure that pupils in other year groups are quiet around examinations spaces which include, the Main Hall and the Old Gym.
