	Governors. KB has seen RSE Policy and it was signed off by MJ	
	in September 2022. RH raised alternative income streams, NP and	
	AB are investigating this. MG asked if income from the sports centre goes to school or AL. Income is invested in the sports	
	facilities. Details are in the financial plan for next year, Anglian	
	Leisure is progressing well but further work needs to be done in	
	terms of promotion and improvement to facilities to maximise profits	
	moving forward. The hockey club is a big user and the pitches are	
	leased virtually at capacity. Pavilion needs replacing and DB is	
	getting quotes, this cannot be funded by the school.	

5. **Budget Recommendation** DR budget has been finalised and is now with the Trustees. There is a deficit budget of £180,000 which will impact certain areas. Additional TA recruitment has been stopped and this will impact the provision we can provide. The school will be supported by Trust reserves but this cannot continue in to the following year. Inflation, utilities cost and staffing are all contributing factors. KB asked if the budget included the teacher pay rise not being funded by the Government. DR The budget includes the teacher pay rise based on 4% so any support from the Government would reduce the deficit. Kemi Badenoch said she was committed to supporting schools. Permission sought from Jon Culpin to publish a response to this article. LS Are other secondary schools in the Trust in the same position? DR Schools across the region are finding the process of budget setting, very challenging. The higher the PP and SEN numbers the easier it is to balance the budget as there is greater income. We also need clarity on our pupil numbers to help with the curriculum and staffing costs. Having a PAN of 210 and then not reaching it has increased costs. With a PAN of 180 the curriculum is more affordable. We need a clear direction for the next 5 years. Cover has been one of the biggest costs. TP The incoming year 7's have only 3 pupils with an EHCP, there will be pupils with undiagnosed SEN needs. RH There is a lack of EP's in Essex. DR There is not the financial capacity currently to employ an EP across the trust. DR LS Will the MAT be under pressure to join a bigger MAT? No, Anglian Learning continues to be a growing Multi-Academy Trust with a strong reputation, locally and regionally. DR 6. Principal's report to include progress Journey Excellence and AIP 2023-2024 DR Rather than a written report I have prepared a presentation, it will go on to the Governors drive afterwards. NP Anglian Learning are moving towards presentations being used, they are more accurate. 7. Sixth Form Long Term Sustainability DR presentation. We believe the 6th form is viable and are very proud of it. Our location and local competition make keeping current pupils difficult. RH is it possible to collaborate with other schools to offer more subjects. DR Netherhall would be a possibility. GB What about the cost of the HOY 12 & 13? DR the HOY will take on more so that the Assistant Principal can take on more ALT duties. We have a 3 year timeline to streamline the curriculum with a compulsory 4th element. LS are we trying to compete with other sixth forms, could we try to be different. KB Students not taking A Levels tend to go to Harlow or CRC. IS we do not have the specialist staff or facilities to offer the same subjects as CRC or Harlow. NP we should be smarter about marketing. TP students often don't stay just because they are ready for new pastures.
