

Principal's Newsletter: *Belonging without judgement*

Dear Parent and Carer,

I hope you have had a positive two weeks since my last newsletter; we have finally made it out of the depths of January and are moving towards the spring which is always a positive step, especially when you start to see snowdrops and the stems of daffodils appearing. On the point of flowers emerging, there was a wonderful example of community spirit on Sunday at JFAN as staff, parents and pupils came together to tidy our Eco Garden in preparation for the months of spring. A great deal of work was completed on an area of our school that we are very proud to showcase and share. I would like to thank all of those who spent time out of their precious weekends to support this cause and of course to Mr Kennedy, who continues to drive forward his agenda, to protect and develop one of the most unique spaces in our school.

Also this week, we welcomed our Sixth Form students and their parents to Parents' Evening yesterday. Of course, this is always an important event where academic conversations take place to support students through challenging post-16 study. For our Year 13 community, it is

always tinged with some emotion as well, as families reflect upon parents' evenings of the past, over a seven year period. This cohort was my first Year 7 when I became Principal of JFAN and I am incredibly proud to have seen the development of these young people over that time. I hope that my note to parents and carers yesterday about this helped to provide reassurance and a sense of calm to a matter which once again had been caused by a damaging and harmful use of social media.

Next week, in our community, we will be creating lots more positive memories for our pupils in the final five days before half-term. It has been a fast-paced first segment of the spring term. We will be hosting exciting events such as our Inter-House competitions in sport which always provide a sense of togetherness and, of course, a sense of healthy competition on the side.

My thought of the week today is from Dr Carl Rogers, an American psychologist, who developed the concept of unconditional positive regard; a powerful reminder about the importance of avoiding judgement without an understanding of context.

He wrote, 'The curious paradox is that when I accept myself just as I am, then I can change. People are just as wonderful as sunsets if you let them be. When I look at a sunset, I don't find myself saying, "Soften the orange a bit on the right hand corner." I don't try to control a sunset.'

- Speed limit on Bury Water Lane: We are reminding all of our community that there is a speed limit of 20 mph on Bury Water Lane. We would like to thank those of you who continue to drop off and pick up your children in other safe places in the village if they do not travel by bus or train. In a speed check exercise last year, undertaken by Essex Highways, the average speed limit on Bury Water Lane was 27 mph; the check was conducted close to the zebra crossing.

The purpose of these tours is to provide current parents and carers a chance to see our community on a typical day which, in some schools, only happens for those whose children are about to join the school in Year 7 or as a mid-year admission. 
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
