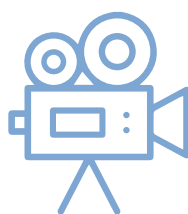

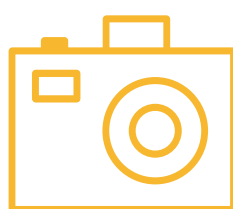

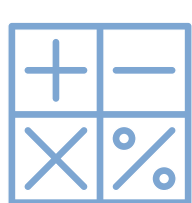

Beyond the classroom, our school develops well-rounded individuals through a diverse range of co-curricular activities.

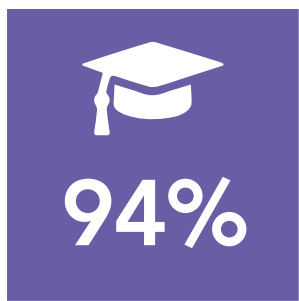

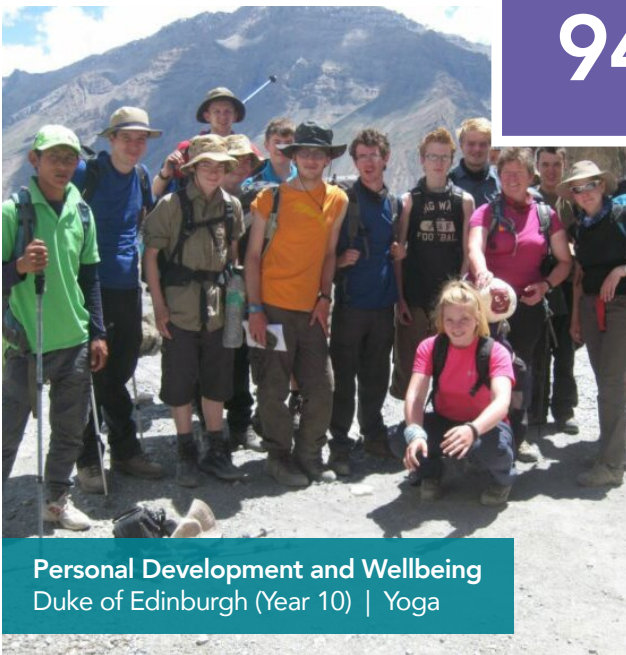
